

## Headline: Air Liquide Australia Plans to Prioritise Carbon Dioxide (CO<sub>2</sub>) Supply

Melbourne, Tuesday 6<sup>th</sup> December 2011.

The latest unexpected delays to the restart of the major Kooragang Island chemical complex in New South Wales will result in CO<sub>2</sub> supply shortage in New South Wales, Victoria and South Australia.

Air Liquide Australia plans to prioritise the supply of  $CO_2$  to industry. Priority allocation of pure  $CO_2$  will be given to essential services such as potable water treatment, blood transport and medical gases.

Air Liquide Australia, a leading industrial gas provider, obtains raw CO<sub>2</sub> from Kooragang Island. The raw carbon dioxide then undergoes purification at Air Liquide's production units, and subsequently liquefaction before delivery to a gamut of industries ranging from food and beverage, utilities, medical and hospitality amongst others.

Since June this year, raw supply from Kooragang Island has been unavailable, prompting Air Liquide to draw down on its inventory and importing from its plants in other states.
